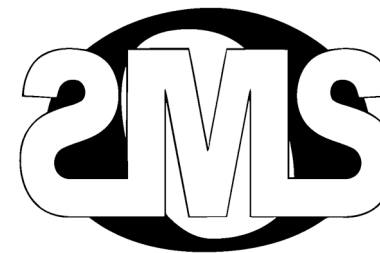

Isabel Sinagola, mezzo-soprano

Isabel Sinagola is a finalist at Somerville College studying English literature and has held a choral award at the college since she began in 2011, singing alto in the Choir of Somerville College and in their offshoot octet. In June 2013 she featured on their Advent CD. She has been singing in her church choir in Bowdon, Cheshire, for 13 years as well as her school's chamber choir and the Hallé Youth Choir in Manchester, under the direction of Oxford Schola Cantorum's conductor James Burton. Isabel has sung many large choral works, including Mozart's Requiem, Händel's *Messiah*, Fauré's Requiem, Elgar's *The Dream of Gerontius*, and Vivaldi's Gloria - performing solos in a number - as well as working on smaller, choral settings every week for evensong, and at weddings and funerals. With her church choir Isabel has sung evensong for a week in the summer in the cathedrals of Beverley, Bath, Lincoln, Wells, Salisbury, Durham, Winchester, St Albans and Christ Church, Oxford, and with Somerville she has been on tour in the North of England, and will next summer tour with them to America. Last summer she sang with Hertford College Choir for a week in Barcelona. In the future Isabel hopes to pursue her choral singing whilst attempting to forge a career with an English degree...

Andrew Dickson, piano

Andrew Dickson started the piano at the age of 4 and the organ aged 11. He accompanied, conducted and wrote music for the St Ignatius Chamber Choir, and was appointed Organ Scholar for St Mary's Wimbledon in 2009. Andrew also spent a year as bandleader for St Ignatius Jazz; a jazz band that reached the final three of the *Yamaha Jazz Experience* (a national competition) and performed at the Cheltenham Jazz Festival. In 2010 he was one of ten pianists selected to play for a masterclass given by Professor Ekaterina Murina (chief professor at St Petersburg Conservatoire). Andrew is very active on the University music scene, playing with the Oxford University Sinfonietta, the Radcliffe Wind Quintet, as part of a jazz quartet, and giving numerous recitals as a soloist and accompanist. Andrew is also a keen singer, having sung in numerous choirs and performed in the English National Opera's performance of *Der Rosenkavalier*. At Oxford, he is a Choral Clerk at Hertford College and a member of the Arcadian Singers.
