Casey Burgess, flute and cello

Casey is a 1st year musician at Hertford and while the flute was her first instrument, the cello is her first love. In 2011 she was awarded the Fellowship Prize and the Peter Davies Woodwind Prize in her county, and also gained her ABRSM diplomas in both the flute and cello. Casey particularly enjoys orchestral playing and chamber music, and was given the position of section principal in her county orchestra for four years.

Daniel Lewis, flute

Daniel is also a 1st year musician currently studying at Hertford College. His principle study is the flute, but he also plays the saxophone and guitar. Since taking up the flute at the age of ten, Daniel has won various competitions and awards in South Wales. He is a member of the National Youth Orchestra of Wales and the National Jazz Youth Orchestra of Wales where he plays saxophone. Daniel's main interest in music however is composition, where he has written works for ensembles such as the Four Counties Youth Orchestra in Wales and a chamber choir in Vancouver.

Guy Newbury, piano

Guy Newbury was born in Inverness and educated there and at Magdalen College, Oxford. He studied piano with the late Denis Matthews and with Audrey Innes, and composition with John Joubert and Jonathan Harvey, before undertaking the PhD in Composition at the University of Durham under the supervision of John Casken. His works have been performed by leading soloists and ensembles including the BBC Philharmonic, the BBC Singers, Jane's Minstrels, the Chamber Group of Scotland, Peter Lawson and Andrew Ball; he also maintains a commitment to new music within Oxford University and has received commissions from the Choir of Magdalen College and from the Oxford Sinfonietta. As a performer, he has been chiefly associated with lieder recitals and contemporary music, and is a founder member of Oxford University's new music ensemble, ISIS. Since 1995 he has been Senior Lecturer in Music at Pembroke College.
