Nicholas Freestone, organ

Nicholas Freestone is currently a music student at the University of Oxford, where he is Senior Organ Scholar of Worcester College. This role involves training the boy choristers of Worcester College, who are all day pupils at Christ Church Cathedral School, alongside accompanying and directing the Boys' and Mixed Choirs in chapel services, in collaboration with the Junior Organ Scholars. Nicholas has accompanied and directed the college choirs on tours to Belgium, France and Germany, and on two recordings, including the critically acclaimed *This Christmas Night* (Resonus Classics).

Alongside college chapel duties, Nicholas is active as an accompanist and recitalist. He was Assistant Organist at St Barnabas Church, Oxford between September 2012 and July 2013, where he accompanied and directs the church choirs on a regular basis. He is regularly Assistant Music Staff for Eton Choral Courses, and frequently accompanies recitals given by singers based in Oxford. A pupil of Stephen Farr, Nicholas is an Associate of the Royal College of Organists.

Nicholas was Organ Scholar of Tewkesbury Abbey and Dean Close School, Cheltenham between September 2010 and July 2011, where he assisted in the accompanying and directing of the Tewkesbury Abbey Schola Cantorum and the Tewkesbury Abbey Choir alongside working in the music department at Dean Close School. Prior to this, Nicholas was a music scholar and organ scholar of Ipswich School and St Mary-le-Tower Civic Church, Ipswich. In September 2014, Nicholas will take up the position of Senior Organ Scholar at Wells Cathedral.
