Simon Grange, bass

Simon Grange is an English bass currently on the Masters of Performance at the Royal College of Music, where he studies with Graeme Broadbent and coach Andrew Robinson. He also studies privately with Robert Lloyd C.B.E. He is a Cuthbert Smith scholar generously supported by a Soirée d'Or Award.

He graduated from Keble College, Oxford in 2012, where he read English, and held a choral scholarship with the Choir of Somerville College, with whom he performed as a soloist many times, including in Händel's *Messiah*, Schubert's *Mass in G*, Tippett's *Child of our Time* and Bach's *St John Passion*. He participated in their premier recording of Milford's *Mass* in 2011, released on the Stone Records label.

He has been heard in recitals across the country. In 2012 he was a Young Artist with MidWales Opera, performing the role of the Commendatore in Mozart's *Don Giovanni*, and in 2013 was a member of Welsh National Youth Opera, performing in their production of Britten's *Paul Bunyan* (bass soloist, Quartet of the Defeated) on the main stage of Cardiff's Millennium Centre. Other opera credits include Bernstein's *Candide* (RNCM) and Beethoven's *Fidelio* (Oxford Philomusica). He recently performed as the bass soloist in Stravinsky's *Renard* with Psappha, under Mark Heron, in a performance at the Cosmo Rodewald Hall in Manchester. He has participated in masterclasses with Susan McCulloch, Henry Herford, Robin Bowman, Margaret Humphrey Clark and Elaine Kidd.

Future engagements include performances of Bach's *St John Passion* (Jesus), the role of Valens in a fully staged production of Händel's *Theodora* with Benslow Baroque Opera, bass soloist in Mozart's *Requiem*, and various recitals in London.

Guy Newbury, piano

Guy Newbury was born in Inverness and educated there and at Magdalen College, Oxford. He studied piano with the late Denis Matthews and with Audrey Innes, and composition with John Joubert and Jonathan Harvey, before undertaking the PhD in Composition at the University of Durham under the supervision of John Casken.

His works have been performed by leading soloists and ensembles including the BBC Philharmonic, the BBC Singers, Jane's Minstrels, the Chamber Group of Scotland, Peter Lawson and Andrew Ball; he also maintains a commitment to new music within Oxford University and has received commissions from the Choir of Magdalen College and from the Oxford Sinfonietta. As a performer, he has been chiefly associated with lieder recitals and contemporary music, and is a founder member of Oxford University's new music ensemble, ISIS.

Since 1995 he has been Senior Lecturer in Music at Pembroke College.
