The group has been set up with singers from within the choir to provide a contrast within concerts and services and to sing music that may be better suited to smaller forces. It was formed at the beginning of the 2011/12 academic year and the intention is that it should grow as a corollary to the main choir.

David Crown, conductor

David started singing as a choral scholar in the choir of King's College, Cambridge, under Stephen Cleobury with whom he has returned several times as soloist. From there he began his singing career winning several prestigious competitions including the National Federation of Music Societies Award and the Wagner Society Bayreuth Bursary. His career as an operatic soloist flourished. He has sung with companies such as Scottish Opera and at the Covent Garden Festival, roles including Don Giovanni, Mephistopheles (Gounod's Faust), Guglielmo (Cosi) and the title role in the The Flying Dutchman as well as performing across Europe, America and Canada, working as soloist with many distinguished musicians including Graham Johnson, Simon Rattle, Richard Hickox, Martyn Brabbins, David Parry and Martin Isepp. He also studied lieder with Olaf Bär and Elly Ameling.

During this time he also conducted several choirs, choral societies and orchestras and playing in a string quartet with members of the leading London orchestras. David has given many recitals at festivals and major venues countrywide including the Wigmore Hall, St. John's, Smith Square, the Cheltenham Town Hall and the Pump Room in Bath as well as oratorio performances at most of the cathedrals around the UK.

He has built a considerable reputation as a singing teacher and teaches choral scholars and others from across Oxford University. As a conductor he studied with among others Colin Metters (Professor at the Royal Academy of Music) and has received excellent reviews for his work (including in *The Times*). He was delighted to be asked to take over as Director of Music at Somerville College in Oxford.

Douglas Knight, harpsichord

Douglas is currently the Senior Organ Scholar at Somerville and studies with Katharine Pardee, in addition to receiving lessons from Daniel Moult and Ann Elise Smoot. He has performed at St. Lawrence Jewry Lane, St. Giles Cripplegate, Union Chapel and other London churches, and as a member of the St. Giles Junior Organ Conservatoire he has played in masterclasses to Dame Gillian Weir, Hans Fagius, David Goode and Robert Quinney. Douglas is also studying the clarinet with Elizabeth Drew having obtained his DipABRSM last summer under his first teacher Nicholas Shipman, with whom he began receiving lessons ten years ago. He has taken part in the North London Music Festival, winning prizes in woodwind classes, and enjoys playing contemporary repertoire.
