

Giulio Potenza was born in Palermo (Italy) in 1990. At the age of six he started his piano lessons with Roberto Giordano. In 2000 he entered the Conservatoire of Trapani where he received his piano diploma under the tutelage of Walter Roccaro. He studied with Franco Scala at the Imola Piano Academy and with Gabriele Baldocci at the International Piano Academy of Sesto Fiorentina. Over the past few years he has attended masterclasses and lessons held by pianists such as Irene Inzerillo, Riccardo Risaliti, Denis Pascal, Christos Sakellaridis, Deniz Gelenbe, Douglas Finch, Bruno Canino, Martino Tirimo, Barry Snyder and Martin Kasik. Giulio has won prizes at several international piano competitions and has performed as a soloist and chamber musician for major agencies and national music associations in Italy and England. He has played concerts with the Florence Symphonietta Orchestra. directed by Piero Bellugi, and the University of London Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Daniel Capp. Recently he has been invited to perform concerts and teach masterclasses at the Hammamett Piano Festival.

Giulio holds a postgraduate diploma (with distinction) from Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music (London) as well as a degree in History from the University of Palermo. He is currently studying as a postgraduate artist at Trinity under the tutelage of Gabriele Baldocci.
