James Soper, saxophone

While at school, James Soper gained ATCL and LTCL diplomas in classical saxophone performance, as well as having the opportunity to perform at the Royal Overseas League and premiere the late Geoffrey Burgon's saxophone concerto. Since then, James has studied classical saxophone performance at the Jāzeps Vītols Latvian Academy of Music under Arvydas Kazlauskas, and at the Royal Academy of Music under Martin Robertson. James is currently a choral scholar at Lady Margaret Hall reading music.

Orly Watson, piano

Having previously studied music at A level, Orly Watson is currently a first-year music student at Somerville College. He studies piano with Michael Dussek from the Royal Academy of Music in London and has achieved a couple of diplomas. Previously, he studied piano with composer and pianist Dr Simon Mawhinney of Queen's University Belfast. Orly also studies organ with Theo Saunders and Baron George Minne, the organists of St. Patrick's Anglican and Roman Catholic Cathedrals, Armagh. He frequently played the organ in the Anglican cathedral himself and has conducted the choir there of which he is also a member. Orly is organist of Donaghmore Parish Church and works extensively around Northern Ireland as an organist. This year Orly sings with the Choir of Somerville College and plays the harpsichord and flute in the Hertford College Orchestra. He often competes in music festivals and competitions around Northern Ireland and has won many first prizes for piano, organ, accompaniment and composition. Last year he was a piano finalist in the Catherine Judge Memorial Award Competition at Queen's University, Belfast.
